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BUS AND TRAIN

Let the public transport system be your personal chauffeur

Around 700 rapid transit and regional railway, bus and ferry lines ensure that you can get just about anywhere you would like to go in and around Hamburg. Have you heard about the HVV app yet?

Besides features such as a stop search and timetable information, you can also buy

reduced price tickets.

TAXI!

Eco-taxis

Even those of us who travel by taxi can do something to improve air quality. Low-emission taxis in Hamburg are declared 'eco-taxis' and are labelled as such. The vehicles run on alternative fuels. Eco-taxis can be recognised by the large stickers found on their bonnets and signage on the taxis. When you order your taxi, a request to travel in a particular vehicle, such as an electrically-powered car, can be made.

Taxi Sharing

With **mytaximatch**, passengers in Hamburg can share a taxi and therefore travel more cost effectively from A to B. Mytaximatch is integrated in the **mytaxi/FREE NOW app** and brings together two passengers with a similar destination. By sharing a ride, both taxi

guests can save up to 50 percent of the journey price. Payments are carried out directly via the mytaxi/FREE NOW app.

emmy Electric Scooters

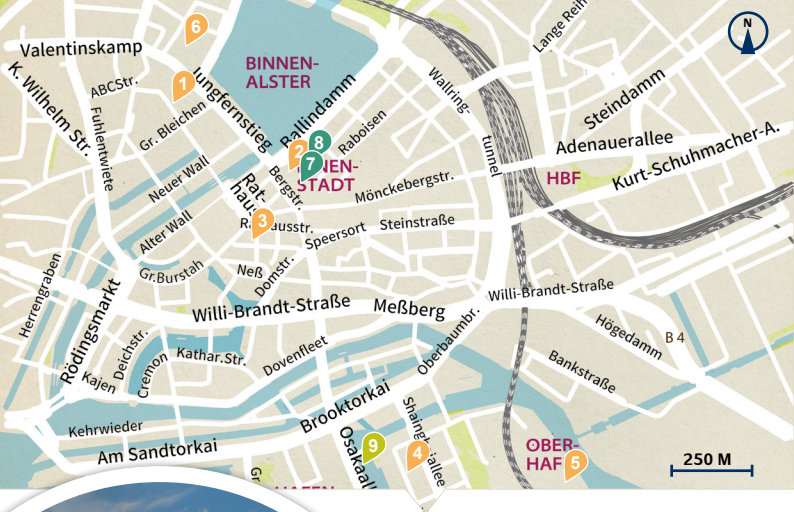

Urban Style with a
Historical Flair

The Altstadt stretches from Rathausmarkt to the last remaining medieval office buildings and fleet canals to the historical Speicherstadt warehouse complex. From Hamburg's oldest district, it is just a stone's throw away to one of the city's newest: Hamburg's HafenCity – a testing lab for the urban life of the future. The area itself is a gigantic recycling product, established on former port and industrial land. Emphasis is placed on being open to future-oriented ideas and this is reflected in the shops and businesses located there.

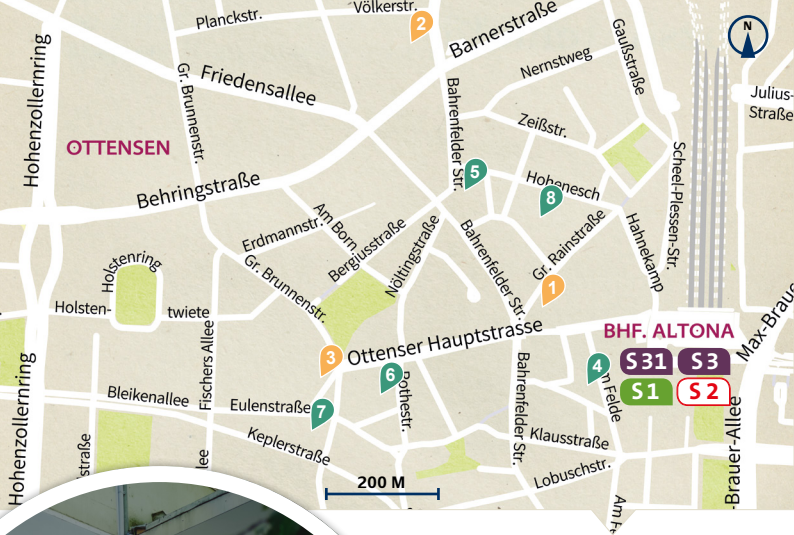

10 Pflanzen un Blomen

Located to the east of the Karo Viertel, between the Congress Center Hamburg and Millerntor, lies the green heart of Hamburg – Pflanzen un Blomen. Rich in tradition, the park is home to the city’s former botanical gardens with their corresponding tropical greenhouse and one of the largest Japanese landscape gardens in Europe, all spread out over an area covering 47 hectares. Here you can watch the world go by in a most relaxing fashion – just simply switch off and unwind. Children’s playgrounds with various water games as well as the romantic water light shows that run from May to the end of August are popular highlights with visitors.

Altona has gone from being a district in which small workshop businesses in courtyards, working men's clubs and inner-city industry dominated the cobblestone streetscape until well into the 20th century, to becoming one of the liveliest, most popular districts. Everything here is a little narrower and closer together than in other parts of Hamburg. The Elbe with the port is within reach. In some old back building workshops, young upcycling designers have emerged with initiatives and eco-conscious products that promote a sustainable future.

You can access the park via Klopstockstraße or Kaistraße.

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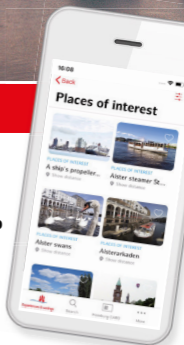
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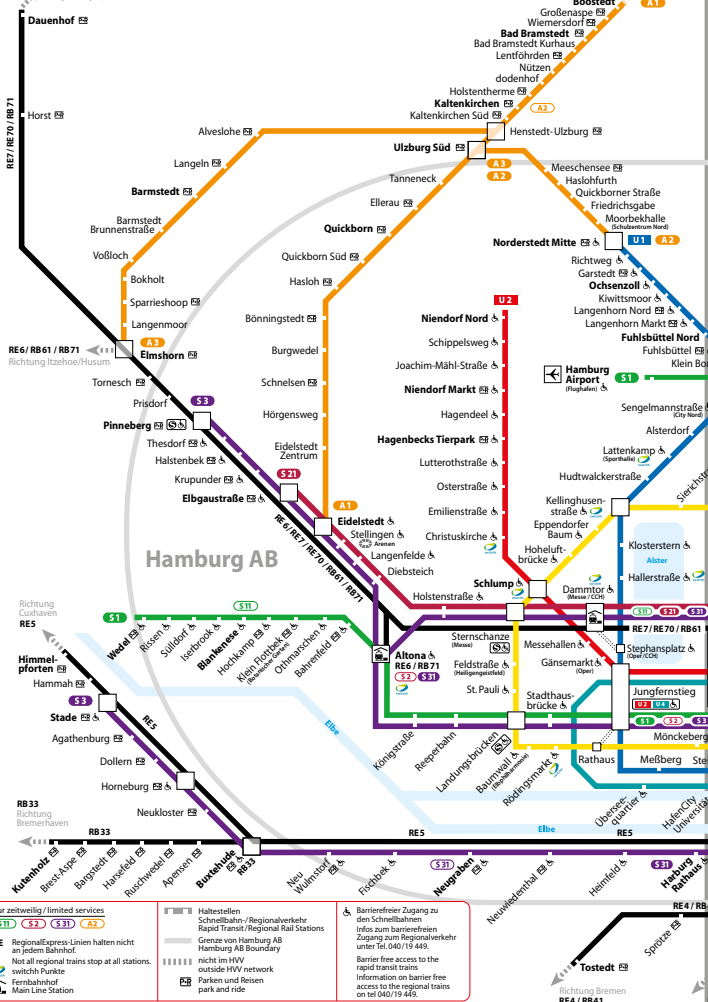
