# THE DAYTIME TOUR

## THE DAYTIME TOUR

### Variety

The perfect start to an exciting sightseeing tour. If you start your voyage of discovery at the **S-BAHN-STATION REEPER-BAHN** (stairs at **HANS-ALBERS SQUARE**), you are already in the immediate vicinity of two famous hotspots of Hamburg nightlife: On your right is Silbersackstraße with the cult pub “Zum Silbersack”, where celebrities like Heinz Rühmann, Freddy Quinn and Hildegard Knef amused themselves decades ago. Just a few metres further straight ahead, you can see the tranquil side of St. Pauli: The picturesque **HEIN-KÖLLISCH-PLATZ**, with

its numerous cafés (e.g. Café Geyer) and restaurants, radiates calm and serenity.

Because even a loud and licentious quarter like St. Pauli needs a haven of peace (and a place for atonement): If you follow Antonistraße, you pass the **ST. PAULI CHURCH**, which opened in 1911. A little further straight ahead, the docks and loader cranes come into view. At the end of the road in **PARK FICHTION** – an urban oasis with artificial palms – you finally have a splendid view over the Hamburg harbour.

#### PANIK CITY –

##### The Udo Lindenberg Experience

The multimedia exhibition PANIK CITY – THE UDO LINDENBERG EXPERIENCE is located on the Reeperbahn, on an area of around 700 m², in the St. Pauli Clubhouse, which has a media façade, which has won many awards. This innovative technological, artistic, and cultural project traces the musical, artistic and socio-political activities of the exceptional artist Udo Lindenberg and uses innovative technology to bring them to life. Groups of up to 20 people are

led by the guides through the different stages of Udo’s life in a 90-minute tour .

Before you set off on your way there, however, it’s worth making a side trip into the **BAVARIAN QUARTER** – a genuine architectural eye-catcher. The best way to get there is via **BERN-HARD-NOCHT-STRASSE** with its houses and pubs, typical for the Kiez, or via **HAFEN-STRASSE**, the colourful façades of which are reminiscent of the years between 1984 and 1990 – of political resistance, squatted houses, and street battles. On the site of the former Bavaria-St. Pauli Brewery, there are now the

apartments, office buildings and hotels of the Neue Hafenkronne district. The legendary Astra beer was brewed here up to 2003.

#### LINE A –

##### The Red Double Decker

With the day ticket of Line A you can explore all the facets of this fascinating harbour metropolis. A day of hop-on, hop-off exploration. The stops in St. Pauli are on the gang-

planks 1-2, on the Reeperbahn opposite the Davidwache and the Hafentreppe.

## THE DAYTIME TOUR Variety

From here you have the perfect view of the heart of Hamburg: The **GANGPLANKS** with their domes and the gauge tower. This former “water railway station” for passenger shipping is now a hub for Elbe ferries, and underground and suburban railways. At its western end is the entrance of the **OLD ELBE TUNNEL**. Pedestrians, car drivers and cyclists can reach the other side of the Elbe through the two 426.5 metre long tunnels of this splendid listed construction. A few hundred metres further to the east of the Elbe, you will

come across the restored sailing ship Rickmer Rickmers, 97 metres long, and one of the last tall ships of commercial shipping. From here you can already see another highlight: The **ELBE PHILHARMONIC**. Hamburg’s new landmark and flagship is an architectural work of art and a unique concert-house offering a magnificent view of Hamburg’s harbour from its publicly accessible plaza. And now that you are already here, we recommend that you make another side trip into **HAFENCITY** – Hamburg’s biggest building project.

### **Panoptikum – The Waxworks**

120 life-sized wax figures of famous personalities, from Elizabeth II to Olivia Jones, await you in the Panoptikum, Germany’s oldest waxworks. Selfies are more than welcome. A free audio guide takes you through the exhibition.

The throwaway society is outdated – at the product design factory Lockengelöt everything revolves around the recycling of everyday objects through re-purposing.

## Lockengelöt

This factory gives everyday objects a new face. Vinyl fans are particularly well-catered for here: Bowls, egg-cups, and lamps are manufactured by hand from old records. A couple of oil barrels also find a new use as a smart cupboard, and books are turned into wardrobes. You will be impressed by both the design and the recycling factor.





# GALLERIES & MUSEUMS

DISCOVER CULTURE



Every year, the Millerntor Stadium becomes an open platform for dialogue and exchange. Artworks from all genres and a varied range of music, culture and training are shown.



In the Maritime Museum, you can see, among other things, around 26,000 model ships from the collection of Professor Peter Tamm Senior.

## Rickmer Rickmers

This 117-year-old tall ship once sailed to Asia and Africa, was afterwards used as a training ship, and has been in the Hanseatic city since 1983. This three-masted barque can be viewed by visitors following elaborate restoration work: On the museum ship the visitors receive interesting insights into shipping over the last 100 years and their means of propulsion – wind, steam and diesel technology.



# HAFENCITY

ARCHITECTURAL  
DELIGHTS

**HafenCity is Hamburg's mammoth construction project: A modern work and residential location is to be created in a maritime location on 1.65 square kilometres of floor area, and Hamburg's urban development is to be driven forward.**

Around 1,800 apartments have already been completed and more than 730 companies are now based in HafenCity. And the end is not yet in sight: This major project is expected to last until around 2025/2030.

But enough of the boring figures! HafenCity is above all an architectural and cultural treat! Hardly any other district combines the past and the modern world in such a unique symbiosis as this district on the Elbe. More than 800 years of harbour tradition and the latest building architecture here face each other.

There are all kinds of things to discover: the International Maritime Museum, the traditional harbour in Sandtorhafen and the Prototyp car museum on Shanghaiallee. And – it cannot be mentioned often enough – since 2017 there has also of course been the much-admired Elbe Philharmonic Hall, a work of art by the Swiss architects Jacques Herzog and Pierre de Meuron that impresses from both outside and inside.

# CRUISE

*HAMBURG'S MARITIME SIDE*

Hamburg is the gateway to the world. Accordingly, there is lively shipping traffic in the heart of the Hanseatic city on the Elbe. This also includes the more than 50 cruise ships that moor in Hamburg every year and transform the Elbe into a stage. Each cruise liner is more impressive than the one before – and yet they all glide majestically and


elegantly on the water, fascinating the many curious onlookers who regularly come to the harbour to take a look. One can marvel at small and large ships at the two cruise terminals in HafenCity and Altona – this is where they moor.

Endless funfair rides and food stands – the Hamburger Dom fair on the Heiligengeistfeld fairground offers action, fun and thrills.

## **Hamburger Dom**

The “Dom” is the biggest funfair in the north: Three times a year, in spring, summer and winter, the Heiligengeistfeld is transformed into an enormous, glittering carpet of light made up of rides and food stalls. Every year, around ten million visitors come to the square between the Millerntor Stadium and Karoviertel. The rides there go rushing into the sky and are not for people with weak nerves. The big wheel offers a more leisurely-paced alternative.

# FC ST. PAULI

*THE KIEZ AND ITS KICKERS*

**From the Kiezclub to the Kultclub: FC St. Pauli can look back on more than a hundred years of history, full of highs and lows, falls and recoveries, with many defeats, yet always keeping its heart in the right place.**

This traditional Hamburg club is regarded as the indie-punk band among professional clubs: Politically committed, united, approachable, humorous, and aware of its traditions – it is an alternative to the establishment and commercialisation. The FCP was the first club in the Bundesliga to introduce rules against sexist and racist remarks in its stadium rules, when such comments were still an everyday occurrence in the Bundesliga. This makes FC. St. Pauli a club with a philosophy that lots of members of the left-wing scene can identify with. This is why there is such a special connection between

the club and its fans. The two combine to form a community of shared values that sticks together through thick and thin, always identifies with its own neighbourhood, and is thus always informed by the question of what the correct attitude is, including outside football.

And the fans are loud! You can hear their cheering and roaring in the 30,000 capacity Millern-tor Stadium on the Reeperbahn, on their Kiez, where they stream after the game with their brown and white skull and crossbones flag.

# THE EVENING/ NIGHT TOUR

*DISCOVER THE ADVENTURE MILE*

Night gradually falls and the first revelers are drawn to the hotspot of Hamburg's nightlife. Soon thousands of tourists and locals are meandering through the Reeperbahn and its many side streets.

The Davidwache is probably Germany's most famous police station and at the same time the headquarters of Europe's smallest police district, covering only 92 hectares.

## Discover Hamburg

The ideal starting point for your night-time tour of the Kiez is the **U-BAHN STATION ST. PAULI**. The two crooked sky-scrapers there mark the start of the 930-metre-long party mile: The **DANCING TOWERS** were designed by the architect Hadi Teherani who described them as a tango-dancing couple or even the knock-kneed legs of a prostitute. The building is the home of the legendary Mojo Club, which, with the right beat and a bar with roof terrace, provides a fantastic panoramic view for merry-makers.

Straight after this is the **SPIELBUDENPLATZ** with its large, mobile stage. Events take place here regularly, such as the Reeperbahnfestival, the transmission of the Eurovision Song Contest, and the Night

Market (every Wednesday). The Spielbudenplatz is surrounded by various cultural locations, their façades sparkling with neon lights:

The **TUI OPERETTENHAUS** is a popular attraction for fans of musicals; the **PANOPTIKUM** is Germany's oldest wax museum and shows wax figures of important personalities – from Hans Albers to Pope Benedict – (Mon–Fri 11 am–9 pm, Sat 11 am–12 midnight, Sun 10 am–9 pm, Spielbudenplatz 3, panoptikum.de), and for all Panik pilgrims the **PANIK-CITY** is a new must-see. The “Udo Lindenberg Experience” combines Lindenberg's music, art and life with the latest technology and was only inaugurated at the start of 2018 (panikcity.de).

## The Evening/Night Tour



Probably the Reeperbahn's best known side street – the Große Freiheit.

Fortunately, however, there are various pleasurable alternatives available on the Reeperbahn. For example, there is the **ST. PAULI MUSEUM** HAMBURG CARD just around the corner. It tells the history and development of the district through photos, documents and films (Mon – Wed 11 am–6 pm, Thur 11 am–9 pm, Fri 11 am–11 pm, Sat 10 am–11 pm, Sun 10 am–6 pm).

A few metres further, the famous venues of **SCHMIDT THEATER**, HAMBURG CARD **SCHMIDTS TIVOLI**, **SCHMIDTCHEN** and **ST. PAULI THEATER** follow in rapid succession. The end of this string of pearls is the pointy-gabled brick building of the **DAVIDWACHE**, the police station famous from the ARD series "Großtstadtrevier".

Strolling (and drinking) gives you an appetite! So it's a good thing that the main source of chips, bratwurst and currywurst is waiting right at the crossing, announced by its flashing letters: The delicious Kiez snack bar **LUCULLUS**.


Then, refreshed, it's time to walk up Davidstraße, past the scantily-clad ladies, to **HERBERT-STRASSE**. This is one of the last brothel streets in Germany. Our apologies to all female tourists: Only men are granted admission to this 60-metre-long street of sin.

A few hundred metres later you will finally arrive at **BEATLES-PLATZ**: Circular, with a diameter of 29 metres and a black surface, it visually resembles a vinyl record.

Five silhouettes stand at its edge, representing the famous mop-tops (including Stuart Sutcliffe). This is another reason why the Reeperbahn is popular with tourists from all over the world: Here on St. Pauli, probably the most famous rock band of all time laid the foundation for their global career – with gigs in the now closed Star-Club on the Große Freiheit.

## The Evening/Night Tour

Apropos **GROSSE FREIHEIT**: It is just around the corner. Here there are strip clubs and table-dance bars, like Susis Show Bar and the Dollhouse, and various music clubs like the Große Freiheit 36. And between these – looking like the last moral authority – stands Hamburg's oldest Catholic church St. Joseph's.

Anyone who feels like more sin can go pub-crawling on the **HAMBURGER BERG** – the home of famous joints like

the Goldene Handschuh, Roschinsky's, Barbarabar and Rosi's Bar, and also the main place to party for many locals. Almost every pub boasts a small dance-floor, table football, and hot Mexican schnapps for toasting. The nearby **HANS-ALBERS-PLATZ**, on the other hand, with its statue of the legendary Hamburg actor of the same name, is a popular attraction for tourists. This is what the Kiez is like: These contrasting places stand close together.

# THE REEPERBAHN

*PLEASURE MILE*

**Sung of and described a thousand times, known as “the most sinful mile in the world”, the Reeperbahn is one of the most famous entertainment sites in the world.**

Popular films such as “Große Freiheit Nr. 7” with Hans Albers from 1944 and songs like “Auf der Reeperbahn nachts um halb eins” have contributed to its popularity and the mythos of St. Pauli. Above all it is the unique atmosphere of the red light and entertainment district, with sex clubs, harbour pubs and music clubs, which attract millions of tourists to St. Pauli every year.

The name itself comes from the ship’s chandlers, the “Reep-schlägern”, who here wove ropes up to 400 metres long into hawsers. When Hamburg incorporated the Reeperbahn and the surrounding district – lovingly called “the Kiez” – in 1894, it had long since become known as an amusement mile for lonely sailors on shore leave. Because of its vicinity to the

Hamburg’s harbour, St. Pauli was soon regarded as a melting pot and meeting place for people from all cultures and social strata. The Kiez and its residents are still regarded as especially tolerant.

But a walk through the Reeperbahn shows that the Kiez is being changed. Visually by modern buildings such as the Dancing Towers and the Klubhaus, and in terms of atmosphere by stag nights, Ibiza-style partying, and commercialisation. Opposing this are the traditional clubs and bars such as the “Zur Ritze” and “Silbersack” and residents who care for the image and tradition of their Kiez. Seen from this perspective, the Kiez is what it always was: a place that is full of contrasts – and never boring.

# REEPERBAHN FESTIVAL

*MUSIC, ART AND READINGS*

---

Every year in September the Kiez more than lives up to its reputation as a meeting place of the nations and a bastion of creativity. During the Reeperbahn Festival, everything is transformed for three days: Church halls are turned into temporary stages and even the smallest pub dive becomes an exciting concert venue. Europe's biggest club festival took place for the first time in 2006, as a pure

music festival, and has grown rapidly since then. Now more than 37,000 people from all over the world stream into the Reeperbahn, where they are entertained during the day with a varied programme of readings and artistic and campus events, and in the evening by exciting music acts in the district's more than 70 clubs. Winner of the European Music Award for "Best Indoor Festival"!







## OLIVIA JONES IN INTERVIEW

Olivia Jones (48) guides tourists through St. Pauli on celebrity Kiez tours, organises party tours of the harbour, and runs a “Schlager” bar on the Große Freiheit, a show club with burlesque, transvestite, and comedy acts, Germany’s first male-strip club, to which only women are admitted, and a flamboyant beer garden on Spielbudenplatz. On top of this, social commitment is very important to her, especially with the aims of enlightenment, tolerance and diversity: Her first children’s book “Keine Angst in Andersrum” provoked conversations throughout Germany.

**WHAT RULES SHOULD PEOPLE STICK TO WHEN VISITING THE KIEZ FOR THE FIRST TIME?** All the rules that would normally apply anywhere else in the world. On top of these, of course, we have a few very special Kiez rules. For example, you should not go taking snaps of tough guys and loose girls, and Herbertstraße is for men only, and Olivias Wilde Jungs, to balance this out, is for women only. And please remember that people not only work and party here, but also live here. So no indiscriminate pissing, put rubbish in the bins, but leave cans and bottles next to them, out of respect for the deposit collectors, and keep the peace on the side streets. And be wary of

bargain offers: You get what you pay for!

**YOUR FIRST TIME ON THE KIEZ: WHAT SHOULD YOU BE PREPARED FOR?** A unique mixture of old and new bars, clubs, theatres, sex and eroticism, flamboyant personalities and party people. And it is a good idea to carry out research at home on the internet, to see where you want to go in the evening and – where possible – perhaps even make a reservation in advance. Here on the Kiez, places can get very full, especially at the weekend. It is annoying when you can't get into precisely the place you wanted.



"Olivias Wilde Jungs" is Germany's only male stripper bar, admitting women only.

**LOOK BUT DON'T TOUCH, OR IS IT OKAY TO TOUCH - WHAT DO YOU THINK?** Look by all means, and touch if you want, but always ask in advance. This place is like a big petting zoo, but even here certain rules apply. Just because a lot of things are possible in St. Pauli, it does not mean that everything goes.

**HOW SHOULD I BEHAVE IF I DON'T WANT TO BE LOOK LIKE A TOTAL NEWBIE?** Say Davidwache, not Davidswache, don't ask any tough boys or ladies of the night if you can take a selfie with them, do not go into Herbertstraße if you are a woman, or the Wilde Jungs if you are a man, and don't drink more than your head and stomach can take.

**WHAT SHOULD I DEFINITELY DO AND WHICH LOCATIONS IN THE KIEZ SHOULD I MAKE SURE I VISIT?** There choice is enormous, and there is something for every taste or lack of taste. As a newcomer, I would play it safe and certainly start off with a tour of the Kiez. They will give you a good overview, and then you can delve into the recommendations afterwards on your own initiative. In my opinion these are absolute must-sees: the gangplanks, Strandpauli, Silbersack, Ritze, St. Pauli Museum. And of course at least the Olivia Jones Bar, Olivias Wilde Jungs and Olivias Show Club. Anyone who is still awake after all that should definitely go to the fish market for a hangover breakfast.

## Rules of Conduct at St. Pauli

St. Pauli is the most tolerant area of Hamburg. Here, however, are some tips that will be useful for visitors to the Reeperbahn:

- ▶ **Bottle ban:** Every Friday evening from 10 pm to Monday morning at 6 am and in the nights before and after public holidays, glass bottles are forbidden around the Reeperbahn.
- ▶ There is a general ban on weapons on the Kiez.
- ▶ Do not order in clubs, bars and pubs until you have looked at the drinks menu. This makes settling the bill easier later on and prevents misunderstandings.
- ▶ If the barkers in front of the sex clubs get too pushy, a friendly "No thank you!" is usually sufficient in most cases. The boys are only doing their job.


